Your child will be covering the following areas of the curriculum this term:

English	Books studied – Macbeth Non-Fiction Genres: instructional writing, biographies, poetry
Maths	Position and direction, decimals, percentages, algebra, converting units, perimeter area and volume, ratio
Science	Evolution and Inheritance, Light
Humanities	History- Local history, WW2
PE	Basketball and Gymnastics (Hawthorn Class Hockey) Table tennis and Dance
Art/DT	Art- Optical art. DT- Textiles
RE	How faith helps us
Music	Develop musical concepts such as dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, pitch and duration. Learn in a kinaesthetic and practical way to develop fine motor skills
French	French Football Champions- Develop strategies to work out what a word might mean and strategies for learning and recalling new words. Children will learn how to write a sports profile. Life at home- Learn how to describe a house, the different rooms and who lives there.
PSCHE	Keeping myself safe, rights and responsibilities
Computing	Computing systems and networks, creating media

Where children are isolating, learning is posted onto Google Classroom daily. This will allow you to focus on your child's learning should you want to revisit this with them.
